#### B. Rationale and Details of Plans

One full-time School Executive Officer with a local bachelor's degree and two administrative assistants will be employed. Their duties will include:

- supporting the administrative work to the IMC;
- > assisting in the handling of school administrative matters;
- > assisting in reviewing school-based mechanisms, internal administrative arrangements and requirements;
- editing different procedural manuals;
- reviewing and editing the school <u>brochure</u>, school plans and reports;
- reviewing and updating school profiles for external publications;
- handling internal and external scholarship applications; and
- liaising with stakeholders of the School.

#### The plan aims at:

- enabling the School to streamline administrative procedures and strengthen school administrative support; and
- > reducing the administrative work of teachers and the school management team to create room for them to focus more on core education tasks and to take care of student development.

#### 3. Citizenship and Social Development Grant

The Liberal Studies curriculum will be optimized and renamed as Citizenship and Social Development (CS) from the school year 2021/22. Due to epidemic prevention measures, Mainland interflow activities or study tours will not be held in 2021/22 school year. It will be proposed to be held in the coming school years if the conditions allow.
